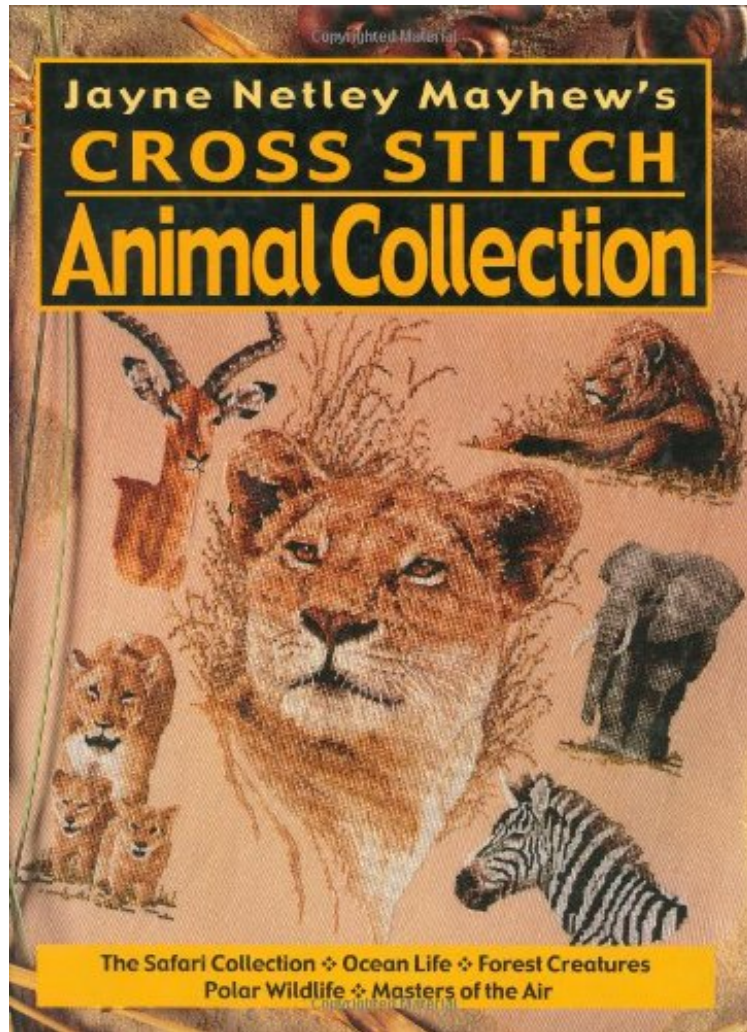

I also may stitch at some point the jelly fish, lioness, hermit crab, and make a bird mobile.The pros about this book are that the patterns are very naturalistic and not cutesy or over simplistic. In other words the animals look like they are supposed to in nature. The other pro is there are hardly any cross stitch books of

this caliber out there, so if you want naturalistic and detailed patterns (without them being of the scanned photo chunky quality), this is as good as it gets. The cons about this book are there is not enough outlining to add the extra dimension necessary to really bring these patterns to life... which means I am going to have to add in all that outlining myself. The other con is for these patterns to look really good... you need to use a high count Aida or even linen. Otherwise the images will look too chunky. I prefer not to stitch on anything lower than 18 count otherwise I start to have trouble seeing what I am doing. So I will have to decide to either accept the final product being chunky or eye strain (by using strong lighting, magnifiers, etc.) These are the patterns included in this book. The large collections can be broken down into their smaller patterns and stitched separately: 1. Safari Collection: Central large lioness surrounded by smaller patterns of a resting male lion, L=lioness with two cubs, African Elephant, Zebra, and Impala 2. Grouping of 4 Ring tailed Lemurs - very large pattern. 3. Grassland with a springbok herd, one is in the foreground the rest are on the horizon line - large pattern. 4. Large rhinoceros - close up of head and face 5. Masters of the Air Collection: Central large golden eagle surrounded by the following slightly smaller patterns - Snowy owl, eagle in flight, hovering kestrel, tawny owl pair (CUTE!), and a bald eagle. 6. Large tawny owl (CUTE!). 7. Very large pattern with a row of six little bee eaters (African bee-eaters). 8. Robin and blue tit mobile - double sided patterns of both birds 9. Forest creatures collection: Central large brown bear surrounded by the following smaller patterns - Two bear cubs, rose deer, stoat, spotted woodpecker, and raccoon. 10. Large puma - seems to be a juvenile by the look of it. 11. Large image of two foxes (mother and juvenile) in profile with grasses. 12. Large pattern of a red stag - mostly of neck, head, and antlers. 13. Ocean life collection: Large central dolphin with smaller surrounding patterns of the following - Four dolphins jumping, whale shark, three blue-striped tropical snappers, hermit crab, and a trio of jelly fish. 14. Large collage of baby sea turtles. 15. Large mackerel shoal (another collage). 16. Large Humpback whale and calf (very endearing). 17. Polar wildlife collection: Large central seal surrounded by smaller patterns for the following - polar bear and cub, orca jumping, two penguins, seal and pup, and arctic fox. 18. Very Large wolf. 19. Very large pattern of a grouping of diving Adelie Penguins. 20. Large mountain hare. 2 of 2 people found the following review helpful.
